## NOTE

Professor Arthur E. Martell, founding Editor of *The Journal of Coordination Chemistry* in 1971, died on October 15, 2003. A pioneer in the field of metal chelate compounds, Martell went to Texas A & M in 1966 as Head and retired in 2001. Martell received the ACS Award for Distinguished Service to Inorganic Chemistry in 1980, was a lifetime member of the New York Academy of Sciences and was an honorary member of the Japan Society of Analytical Chemistry. As Founding Editor and Editor for ten years, Art Martell was instrumental in the growth of the *Journal of Coordination Chemistry*. He continued as an active reviewer and Editorial Board Member until his retirement.
