Out With the Old in With the *News*: A New Year Sees “Topical News Articles” Being Introduced to the *Journal of Fluorescence*

The *Journal of Fluorescence* now publishes a new class of articles called “*Topical News Articles*”. These new additions to the Journal must satisfy the following criteria:

- The article should describe a new and important concept in fluorescence for which an article has been accepted for publication or was published within the last several months.
- The new concept must be of wide interest to the fluorescence community.
- The concept should be described in adequate detail to be understood by practicing spectroscopists, but not with the level of detail typically used in a peer-review publication.

- The predictions for the use of the new concept in fluorescence should be described.
- The article should typically not exceed two Journal pages, including figures, tables, and references.

These brief articles are reviewed in the editorial office and a decision on publication will be made within one month.
