

Topical News Articles

The *Journal of Fluorescence* now publishes a new class of articles called “*Topical News Articles*.” These new **peer-reviewed additions** to the *Journal* must satisfy the following criteria:

- The article should describe a new and important concept in fluorescence for which an article has been accepted for publication or was published within the last several months.
- The new concept must be of wide interest to the fluorescence community.
- The concept should be described in adequate detail to be understood by practicing spectroscopists, but not the level of detail typically used in a peer-review publication.

- The predictions for the use of the new concept in fluorescence should be described.
- The article should typically not exceed two *Journal* pages, which includes figures, tables, and references.

These brief articles are primarily reviewed in the editorial office, and a decision on publication will be made within 1 month.
