A Review of Truth and Science, A Bibliography

REFERENCE: Ansley, Norman and Horvath, Frank, *Truth and Science, A Bibliography*, American Polygraph Association, Linthicum Heights, Md., 1977, 127 pages, no price listed.

This is a comprehensive bibliography of books, articles, and leading news publications, published here and abroad between 1895 and 1976, covering the subject of detection of deception and polygraph techniques. Both favorable and anti-polygraph references are included. The book does not list minor news articles, brief references in texts and books, unverified foreign publications, or legal decisions relating to admissibility of polygraph evidence.

I strongly recommend *Truth and Science, A Bibliography* as a valuable reference, and it could also serve as an example for those charged with preparing a syllabus in a forensic science certification program.
