A Review of *Toxicity and Forensic Implications of Cannabis Sativa Linn*

This monograph, a review of 277 references in the *Cannabis* literature published between 1842 and 1975 should prove useful to many forensic scientists. The text, presented in tabular form, synthesizes topic areas like history of *Cannabis* use, metabolites, and toxicity. Little information concerning analysis is included.
