A Review of The Expert Witness

The Expert Witness is a very basic monograph concerning the conduct of the qualified expert witness in the courtroom. All areas concerning deposition, courtroom testimony, pretrial preparation (including fees), and determination of a qualified witness are presented in a somewhat general manner with some areas such as "Trick Questions" given a very superficial treatment.

An expert who is about to testify for the first time might utilize this short monograph as a starting point. The "suggestions on being a good witness" would be quite useful for the beginner.
