With this issue we start the 16th Volume of the Journal of Global Optimization (JOGO) with 12 issues per year. We plan to extend the areas of our coverage to include control theory, variational problems, and generalized convexity. However, a person does not have to be nominated to win the award. The prize committee will consist of the editor-in-chief and another two members of the editorial board of JOGO. The 1999 Best Paper Award Committee consists of H. Sherali and S. Vavasis. The deadline for the 1999 Best Paper Award award is May 1, 2000

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the new and continuing members of the editorial board of JOGO for agreeing to serve. I would like also to thank the departing members for their time of dedicated service.
