

Forthcoming Event

2nd World Congress of Chemical Engineering and World Chemical Exposition, Montreal, Canada, October 4–9, 1981.

This event is co-sponsored by: The Interamerican Confederation of Chemical Engineering, The European Federation of Chemical Engineering and The Asian Pacific Confederation of Chemical Engineering.

The technical program will include sessions covering all the important aspects of chemical engineering. Twelve sessions will be held simultaneously. Each session will contain five to seven half-hour presentations, including discussion.

Seveso Report

The Health and Safety Executive, Derbyshire, Great Britain, has prepared a translation of a comprehensive official report by the Italian Parliamentary Commission of Enquiry concerning the escape of toxic substances at the ICMESA (Industrie Chimiche Meda Societa Azionaria) establishment at Seveso, Italy, on 10 July 1976 and the consequent dangers to health and the environment. Copies of the translation of the report (HSE Transl. No. 8287) which has been printed with the permission of the Parliament of the Republic of Italy, are now available, at £25 per copy (plus postage and packing).
