## World Conference on Chemical Accidents Rome, Italy, July 7–10, 1987

The World Health Organisation is sponsoring this major World Conference in association with the International Programme on Chemical Safety, Switzerland and the Istituto Superiore di Sanità, Italy. The conference will present an evaluation of the prevention of, and preparedness for, chemical accidents in order to contain the impact of such accidents and improve the response to these emergencies.

The conference will cover all types of chemical accidents including accidents occurring at stationary facilities (either confined within the facility or spreading out into the general environment); accidents taking place during the transportation of chemicals, accidents due to misuse of chemicals; accidents involving food chain contamination; accidents related to the disposal of wastes and case studies such as: Bhopal, Seveso, Love Canal, Minamata, Ground water pollution in Venice, Toxic oil in Spain, Dioxins in Missouri, and transfrontier problems.

The main topics are:

- Prevention
- Contingency planning
- Emergency response

- Rehabilitation following chemical accidents
- Case studies and surveys
