2nd International Specialist Meeting on Major Hazards in the Transport and Storage of Pressure Liquefied Gases, 27–30 May, 1990, Kingston, Canada

Scope

The Major Hazards 90 meeting will be held on the Queen's University main Campus in Kingston, Ontario, Canada from May 27–30, 1990.

Timetable

Abstracts of conference papers were due 30 May 1989.

Invitations to authors to submit full papers for review have been made in June, 1989, and full papers were due 30 August, 1989.

The notification to authors of acceptance of papers will be made by 1 November 1989.

Camera-ready copies of papers for the meeting are due by 1 January 1990.

Proceedings

Accepted manuscripts will appear as a special issue of the *Journal of Hazardous Materials* that also published the proceedings of the 1st Meeting (held at Fredericton, New Brunswick, Canada, August 10–3, 1987) in December, 1988. This journal has agreed to provide the meeting with copies of this issue to be sent to registrants as a record of the proceedings. A book of abstracts will also be provided at the meeting.
