

U.S. Environmental Laws, published by BNA Editorial Staff, The Bureau of National Affairs, Inc., Washington, D.C., 1988, ISBN 0-87179-568-X, 874 pp., US \$45.00.

The second edition of *U.S. Environmental Laws* contains the complete texts of eight different environmental laws and summaries of nine other important U.S. federal statutes. Each law (or statute) noted below is preceded by a short introduction describing the history, philosophy and overview of the law. The eight laws reproduced in detail are:

1. NEPA (National Environmental Policy Act)
2. CERCLA (Comprehensive Environmental, Response, Compensation and Liability Act)
3. TSCA (Toxic Substances Control Act)
4. FIFRA (Federal Insecticide, Fungicide and Rodenticide Act)
5. RCRA (Resource Conservation and Recovery Act)
6. CAA (Clean Air Act)
7. CWA (Clean Water Act)
8. EPCRA (Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act of 1988)

Coupled with Government Institutes' (Rockville, Maryland) *Environmental Law Handbook* which explains and discusses the above-noted laws, one has an excellent start (if not the completely needed works) on the topic of U.S. environmental law.
