eral, state and local government agencies on what was spilled, the amount spilled, the time, location and effects of the spill. The *Spill Reporting Procedures Guide* has been developed as an aid to fulfilling these reporting requirements.

The Guide is divided into two major sections:

- 1. Federal reporting requirements and
- 2. State reporting requirements (covering all 50 states).

The Guide contains the verbal and written reporting requirements for oil, hazardous substance, hazardous waste, hazardous materials, excess air emissions, wastewater excursions, underground storage tank leaks and SARA Title III.

The seventh edition of the Guide reflects changes in federal and 41 state requirement names, mainly caused by changes in agency, telephone numbers and addresses.

Remedial Action, Treatment, Disposal of Hazardous Waste, Proceedings of the Sixteenth Annual RREL Hazardous Waste Research held by U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Cincinnati, OH, August 1990, EPA No. 600/9-10/037, 656 pp., no price given.

The U.S. EPA Risk Reduction Engineering Laboratories (RREL) in Cincinnati, Ohio sponsors a symposium each year in order to assure that the results of their sponsored research projects are rapidly transmitted to the user community. These Proceedings contain 48 full papers (of various length) and 22 single page reports (which I assume were presented on a poster session format).

The papers cover a wide variety of topics with waste minimization, incineration and soil treatability (both chemical and biological) being the most common types — I read a half a dozen papers; they were generally excellent.

A minor suggestion for next year publish the full addresses of the papers authors. Of times, I wish to write to an author (selfishly ask them to review a paper or to answer a question). It would be more helpful to have the information at hand.
