INTRODUCTORY NOTES

1. This index covers *JHS* volumes lxi (1941) to xc (1970). Reference is made in it also to the Archaeological Reports which, since 1955, have been separate from the main volumes.
2. The spelling of Greek names in articles and notes has not been consistent over the thirty years. In this index, except in Section I, the spelling of the Oxford Classical Dictionary is, in the main, followed.
3. In Section I (Tables of Articles and Notes) all articles and notes are listed by volumes, with page references, full titles as spelt by the authors, and authors' names. Contents of Archaeological Reports are given at the end. Readers are asked to refer to this section, when necessary, both from Section II, where no titles are given, and from Section III, where titles are often abridged and authorship is not mentioned. They are also invited to consult it, before actually resorting to a volume of the Journal, in order to form some idea of the general context of any reference of interest to be found in Sections III, IV, V or VI.
4. Section II (Index of Authors) is intended to include references to all articles (A), notes (N) and reviews (R) contained in the thirty volumes and to the articles in the accompanying Archaeological Reports. In this Section the first page only of each review is quoted. By a review is meant a single article or short notice signed or initialled once by the author. It may of course deal with more than one book. The entry 86, 288(2) indicates that two such reviews by the author concerned begin on page 288 of volume 86.
5. Section III (General Index of Subjects), though selective only, is intended nevertheless to provide fair coverage in outline of all the subject matter. Here, under each head, where applicable, reference is made first to titles of articles (A), then to titles of notes (N), both often abbreviated. These are followed by other references (O) which relate to details either from within the articles or notes just referred to or from elsewhere. Finally come references to reviews (R). The names quoted here are those of the authors of books reviewed, and by looking these up in Section VII the reader can find the titles of books relating to any particular subject and also the volume and page reference and names of the reviewers. As a general rule separate headings are not given in this section for a noun and its adjective. Only in a few cases, e.g. under Athens and Athenian, has it been thought more suitable for the two to be distinguished. Otherwise the noun should be taken as including the adjective. Thus Sparta covers Spartan. Although entries under Greece and Greek have been kept to a minimum, the opposite is the case with Rome and Roman, since in the *JHS* a bearing on Roman studies is less to be expected. A few Greek words, some of which are written in Roman letters, are included in this section.
6. Sections IV and V (Indexes of Greek and Latin Authors and Greek Words) are, of course, selective. In Section IV only those passages are given which attract some significant discussion relating to their text or to the interpretation of their wording. In Section V only those words are listed which receive special consideration as to their meaning or the nature of the objects to which they refer. Some of the Greek words featuring among the headings in Section III are repeated here. Section VI (Epigraphical Index) is intended to refer to (a) every inscription newly published in these volumes and (b) those others which figure at all prominently in the discussions in articles or notes. Places of origin are given, separately for each of these two classes, and, for the second, references to previous publications. Though the list of Greek words is selective only, the index of names and titles is, it is hoped, complete for the inscriptions covered.
7. Section VII (Index of Books Reviewed) is intended to be complete, though here and there titles of books have been slightly shortened or, in the case of editions or translations of classical authors, modified to suit the requirements of a composite list. The following points should be noted. (a) Texts and translations of classical authors, with or without notes, are listed under the name of the author concerned, with cross references from the names of the editors or translators. Commentaries without accompanying texts, however, come under the names of the commentators; but references to these will also be found in the General Index of Subjects (Section III) under the names of the classical authors. (b) Publications of inscripational and papyrus texts are assembled under the headings Inscriptions and Papyri respectively; cross references to them will be found from the names of the editors. (c) Standard reports on archaeological excavations are referred to under the name of the area, e.g. Afghanistan, or the site, again with cross references from the names of the authors. (d) An asterisk placed against the name of a reviewer indicates that the book concerned has received a Short Notice as distinct from a review proper. It should be borne in mind, however, that, especially in the earlier volumes, some of the reviews themselves are very short and several books are often covered in a single article.
8. In conclusion, I wish to thank Professor H.L. Hudson-Williams who has greatly lightened my task by allowing me, for seven years, the loan of thirteen volumes of the Journal which would not otherwise have been available to me at home.
