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INTRODUCTORY NOTES

This index has been modelled on its predecessor, with a division into six sections. As the *Archaeological Reports* have been published separately for the period covered, tables of contents only are included, and consequently the epigraphic section (VI) is shorter and less detailed. Individual Greek words have been included in the general index.

Notes on individual sections

- I. The contents as they appear listed in individual volumes, with full titles and pagination.
- II. The contents of *Archaeological Reports*, which is published annually as a supplement to the *JHS*. Volumes 23 (1976–77) and 33 (1985–86) contain site indexes to volumes 13–22 and 23–32 respectively.
- III. The authors of articles (identified as (A), notes (N) and reviews (R)), with the volume and page numbers of their contributions.
- IV. A general index of the subjects treated. In this reference is made to relevant articles (A), notes (N) and substantial other discussions (O). Where applicable, at the end of the entry will be found a list (R) of the authors of relevant books which are reviewed and of which details will be found in the review section. In cases where several books by the same author have been reviewed they are numbered in the review section and in the general index the author's name is followed by a superscript number; so (R) Smith, (S.)² refers to the second book by S. Smith.
- V. Greek and Latin authors. This is necessarily highly selective.
- VI. Epigraphic index; divided into (A) Index of find-spots of inscriptions referred to and (B) publication details of these inscriptions.
- VII. Review index; that is, an index of works reviewed, together with the name of the reviewer and the volume and page number in which the review may be found. The inconsistencies in the transliteration of Greek names reflect differences in the practice of individual scholars over the period covered. It is hoped that these will not present problems to the user.

Finally, I must thank Professor A.H. Sommerstein, Dr L. Rodley, Mrs S. Sadler and Mr P. Jackson for their assistance in the compilation of this index, and my family for their patience and interest throughout.
