The Laukien Prize

Nominations are being solicited for the 2001 Laukien Prize. The Laukien Prize was established in 1999 to honor the memory of Professor Günther Laukien, a co-founder of Bruker Instruments. The Laukien Prize is intended "to recognize cutting-edge experimental NMR research with a high probability of enabling beneficial new applications" and carries a monetary award of \$15,000 funded by Bruker Instruments. The work being honored should have been published within the last three years. In special cases, the award may be given for cumulative achievements over a longer period. The presentation of the Laukien Prize is a highlight of the Experimental Nuclear Magnetic Resonance Conference (ENC). The conference program includes plenary lectures and poster presentations in all major areas of NMR research, including solution, solid state, and imaging techniques. The 42nd ENC will be held March 11-16, 2001, in Orlando, Florida. The 2001 Laukien Prize will be presented together with an award lecture on March 12, 2001.

Nominations should include the following:

- 1. Name of nominee and nominee's affiliation, address, phone, fax, and e-mail.
- 2. Name of nominator and nominator's address, phone, fax, and e-mail.
- 3. A brief (no more than 200 words) description of the work serving as the basis for the nomination.
 - 4. A list of relevant publications (no more than 5).
