This issue of the *Journal of Mathematical Chemistry*, which marks the completion of our third year of existence, provides me with a convenient opportunity to announce an important new development concerning our journal. As I have mentioned in past Editorials, our journal is now enjoying growing support and acceptance from many different quarters. This trend is a highly gratifying one, but has unfortunately brought in its wake a mounting burden on your Editor as ever more manuscripts are received for publication. Because of this steadily increasing burden, we have decided to institute a major change from the beginning of 1990. I have asked two very distinguished mathematical chemists to share with me joint editorship of our journal and I am happy to report that both have accepted. Starting with the next issue, the two new Editors joining me will be Professors Paul Mezey and Nenad Trinajstić, and I shall continue to be involved as Consultant and Founding Editor.

The two new Editors will assume responsibility for the handling of all correspondence with authors relating to the publication of material in the *Journal of Mathematical Chemistry*, the refereeing process, and the dispatch of accepted manuscripts to the printer.
