Publisher's note

The Journal of Organometallic Chemistry published its 500th volume a few months ago. It carried an informative note about the changes which will be effective as from this volume: the appointment of Professors François Mathey and Michael Mingos as Regional Editors for the journal and of Professor Gerard van Koten as the Subject Reviews Editor for Europe.

As from 1996, a new section will be introduced in the journal. The Priority Communications will be processed through a specific fast track procedure in order to provide the readers and the authors with an adequate rapid publication service.

Papers submitted as a Priority Publication should comply with the following requirements:

- 1. All papers are published in English. They will carry a short abstract and 4-6 keywords.
- 2. All papers are submitted on a hard copy (paper) and on a diskette.
- 3. The maximum length of a paper does not exceed 5 printed pages and 2 figures.

- 4. The Priority Communications are added in the first available issue regardless whether it is a Special Issue or not.
- 5. The publication times will be of 5-10 weeks from receipt of the final version by the Publisher.
- 6. There will be no proofs unless explicitly requested by the authors.
- 7. The paper submitted as a Priority Communication should describe new research results of prominent interest for which speed of publication is vital.
- 8. The main author of a Priority Communication will receive 25 free offprints from his paper.
- 9. Priority Communications should be submitted to the Regional Editors and clearly designated as such. In case the papers do not fulfill the requirements, the Regional Editor may suggest to the author to process them as regular articles or as a Preliminary Communication.

It is the Editors' and the Publisher's aim to confirm the important role the *Journal of Organometallic Chemistry* plays in the development of this scientific discipline.
