
EDWARD WHEELOCK RUNYON.

Edward Wheelock Runyon is listed among those who have held membership in the AMERICAN PHARMACEUTICAL ASSOCIATION for more than fifty years—Mr. Runyon became a member in 1875.

The subject of this brief sketch was born in Chicago, November 7, 1851. At the age of 16 years he came to New York and served apprenticeship in a Greenwich Village pharmacy. In 1871 he matriculated at the New York College of Pharmacy and was graduated by this institution in 1873. He removed to San Francisco in 1877 and established the first pharmaceutical laboratory on the Pacific Coast for the manufacture of fluidextracts, gelatin-coated pills and other pharmaceutical preparations. He is now President of Boericke & Runyon, Inc., engaged in the manufacture of homeopathic and other pharmaceutical preparations and publishers of medical books.

From 1883 to 1893 Mr. Runyon was professor of Pharmacy and dean of the Faculty of California College of Pharmacy, a Department of the University of California. He was a Vice-President of the AMERICAN PHARMACEUTICAL ASSOCIATION 1883–1884 and its Local Secretary for the meeting of 1889, held in San Francisco.

Mr. Runyon is a member of the New York Chamber of Commerce, the American Museum of Natural History, the New York Zoölogical Society, the New York Aquarium Society, the New York Microscopical Society, the Lotos and the Chemists' Club. The veteran member enjoys good health and is active in the affairs of the business of which he is the head.
