

PRESIDENT-ELECT OF AMERICAN PHARMACEUTICAL ASSOCIATION 1920-1921.

C. Herbert Packard, President-elect of the American Pharmaceutical Association for 1920–1921, was born in Amherst, Mass., in 1863. He was educated in the public schools of Boston and, later, at Arms Academy, Shelburne Falls, Mass. In 1885 he purchased the drug store in which he had been employed for five preceding years, at 46 Maverick Square, East Boston; in 1900 Mr. Packard acquired another store by purchase at 7 Central Square, and still owns and conducts both of these establishments.

The President-elect graduated from the Massachusetts College of Pharmacy in 1892, was elected a trustee of the College in 1904, and has been its president since 1909. When the New England Branch of the American Pharmaceutical Association was organized the subject of this brief sketch was elected its president, holding the office for three consecutive years. He was Local Secretary of the American Pharmaceutical Association for the meeting of 1911 in Boston; Third Vice-President of the Association in 1912; Second Vice-President in 1914, and Chairman of the General Membership Committee A. Ph. A. in 1913.

In 1907 Mr. Packard was President of the Massachusetts State Pharmaceutical Association. He has been a member and the treasurer of the Boston Retail Druggists' Association since its organization. While giving most of his spare time to pharmaceutical organizations and his Alma Mater, he takes an active interest in municipal affairs and is a member of a number of fraternal organizations.
