METHYL CHLORIDE POISONING.

The American Medical Association has appointed a committee to look into the danger of poisoning from methyl chloride used in some makes of domestic refrigerators. The committee includes Dr. H. Gideon Wells, professor of pathology in the University of Chicago; Dr. R. L. Thompson, of the U. S. Public

Health Service; Dr. Carey P. McCord, associate professor of preventive medicine in the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine; Yandell Henderson, Ph.D., professor of physiology in Yale University School of Medicine, and Paul N. Leech, Ph.D., director of the chemical laboratory, American Medical Association.
