A. L. I. WINNE.

The chairman of the House of Delegates is a native of Virginia and a graduate of the School of Pharmacy of the Medical College of Virginia. He has taken an important part in the work of the Virginia Pharmaceutical Association, Boards of Pharmacy and the AMERICAN PHARMACEUTICAL ASSOCIATION for many years.

Mr. Winne has been the secretary of the Virginia Board of Pharmacy since 1919 and is largely responsible for the splendid record this board has made in its work as a registering agency and in its enforcement of the laws entrusted to it.

In the Virginia Pharmaceutical Association, he has served as secretary since 1920, as treasurer since 1927, as editor of the Virginia Pharmacist, the official publication of the Association, since 1919 and as its delegate on many occasions.

His connection with the Virginia Board of Pharmacy brought Mr. Winne into the National Association Boards of Pharmacy where he has served on important Committees and as the president in 1931-1932.

Since 1919 Mr. Winne has been an active member of the AMERICAN PHARMACEUTICAL ASSOCIATION and has served it in many important capacities including the first vice-president in 1929-1930. Space permits reference to only two of his valuable contributions. As the first chairman of the Committee on Pharmacy Corps in the U. S. Army he directed a campaign which finally brought commissions to pharmacists in this branch of the United States service. In 1927 he was instrumental in organizing the Conference of Pharmaceutical Association Secretaries and was the first president of this group, which has served a very useful purpose in bringing these key officers of state and local associations into a strong working organization.

Chairman Winne is deeply interested in the House of Delegates and at the New York meeting opened a discussion on "Making More Effective the Affiliation between the A. Ph. A. and the State Pharmaceutical Associations." His election as chairman of the House is another well-deserved recognition of his services to Pharmacy.
