This year the Journal of Pharmaceutical and Biomedical Analysis enters a new stage in its development, with the larger page, doublecolumn format and a new production style. These changes reflect a number of current trends in scientific publishing, namely the need to utilize space as effectively as possible and with the greatest clarity. The larger page size brings the Journal of Pharmaceutical and Biomedical Analysis into line with its sister Journals published by Pergamon, *Talanta* and *Spectrochimica Acta B*. We wish to express our thanks to the retiring members of the Editorial Advisory Board and our special thanks are also due to Mr Peter Henn, who was instrumental in establishing the Journal some 9 years ago. His duties have taken him to other areas so that we now welcome the new Editorial Director for the Journal, Dr Peter Shepherd. We also welcome a number of new members of the Editorial Advisory Board and look forward to their enthusiastic contribution in developing the Journal as one of the key publications for the development of pharmaceutical and biomedical sciences in the 1990s.
