

Any scientist, institution, company interested to support, promote, pursue and future the aims and goals of the APT — the initiation, promotion and strengthening of Photosciences in and for the Tropical region — is invited to join the APT.

The APT was founded after many years of activities and experiences related to the huge field of "Photosciences in the Tropics", much input, requests and discussions with colleagues from many disciplines and geografic regions and already two successfully conducted "South-East Asian Workshops on Photobiology in the Tropics (SEAWPIT)". We would like to thank all colleagues who participated actively in the founding process. Several of them are now founding members of the APT.

Two points important to know for APT-members /-candidates:

First,

due to the positive financial situation at the end of 2002 we decided to collect NO membership fee for at least the year 2003 temporarily overruling the membership fee regulation stated in the APT constitution.

The aim of this measure is to enable as many colleagues as possible especially from tropical countries to join and participate in the aims and goals of the APT by supplying and sharing experience, common interests and pressing research and teaching needs — without being restricted by their mostly limited funds.

We are presently working to extend the "membership free regime" by aquisition of sponsors and donations.

The more financial support we secure the more supporting activities we will be able to finance. Every member is called on to be also active in these fund-gaining activities.
