Tenth International Conference on Photochemistry, The University of Crete, Iraklion, Crete, Greece, September 6 - 12, 1981

The Conference will be held at Iraklion, Crete, Greece. The lectures and poster sessions will take place in the main assembly room of the Chamber of Commerce which offers excellent modern facilities for several hundred participants.

The format of the Tenth International Conference on Photochemistry will be one which allows the widest possible scope for critical and constructive discussion, and for exchange of information, on the major aspects of photochemistry. Photochemical Aspects of Solar Energy Storage and Utilization
