

## **Publisher's Note**

The new United States Copyright law came into effect on 1 January 1978. Users of this journal should note that, in order to conform with the provisions of this law, certain changes in publication procedure will be made.

Authors resident in the U.S.A. will be asked to transfer copyright in writing, using a form provided by the Editor-in-Chief. Most papers will carry a multi-digit code at the foot of the first page. The code will signify that Elsevier Sequoia participates in the non-profit-making scheme run by the Copyright Clearance Center. Consent is given for copying all or part of an article for personal use, or for the personal use of specific clients. This consent is given on the condition that the copier pays through the Center the per-copy fee stated in the final digits of the code on the first page of each article for copying beyond that permitted by Sections 107 or 108 of the U.S. Copyright Law. The appropriate fee should be forwarded with a copy of the first page of the article to the Copyright Clearance Center, Inc., 21 Congress Street, Salem, MA 01970. If no code appears in an article, the author has not given broad consent to copy and permission to copy must be obtained directly from the author.
