Preface

These edited Proceedings are a valuable record of the technical programme of the Fifth Asian Battery Conference held in Bali, Indonesia from 1 to 3 September 1993. This Conference is a continuation of the successful series previously held in Hong Kong, Singapore, Bangkok and Seoul. A list of the record number of delegates from 32 countries that attended the Bali meeting is given in Section 8, pages 271–275.

The aims of the Asian Battery Conferences are to promote a better understanding of the Asian battery industry, to encourage mutual cooperation within the region, and to provide a forum for the introduction of new technology and equipment to Asian battery manufacturers.
