## 1972 INTERNATIONAL CLAY CONFERENCE

Madrid, 25th June, 1972

The "1972 International Clay Conference" will take place in Madrid (Spain) from the 25th to the 30th June, 1972. The Conference is being organized by the Spanish Clay Society (S.E.A.), under the auspices of the "Association Internationale pour l'Etude des Argiles" (A.I.P.E.A.).

The main purpose of the Conference is to promote international cooperation in the study of clays through scientific sessions, publications and field-trips.

#### SCIENTIFIC SESSIONS:

The scientific sessions will be held in the Conference and Exhibition Palace of the Ministry of Information and Tourism (Avenida del Generalísimo, 29 Madrid-16).

During the Conference a joint meeting of the "Working Group" of the "Kaolin Correlation Program" is planned, with the following program:

- 1. Discussion of the Project.
- 2. Contribution to the study of kaolins.
- 3. Field-trips to Spanish kaolin deposits.

The Symposium will be open to all participants attending the Conference. Prof. KUZVART (Secretary of the "Working Group") and Prof. Martín VIVALDI (Spanish representative of the "Working Group") will act as Chairmen of this Symposium.

#### PUBLICATIONS:

The about 150 abstracts received before the 30th September, 1971 will be published by the Spanish Committee in an "Abstracts Booklet" which will be distributed to the participants before the Conference.

The authors of the about 60 selected papers to be presented at the Conference are requested to send the complete text to the Organizing Committee (Spain) before 30th of April, 1972. Papers will be reproduced and distributed to the participants at the Conference, besides their publication in the proceedings that will be distributed soon after the Conference.

The Editorial Committee will select a certain number of additional papers for possible consideration during the discussion periods at the discretion of the Section Chairman. They might even replace papers in the sessions that were admitted but which were not submitted on time. In this case, if the text is available, it will be considered for publication, after being submitted to normal review.

Both in the proceedings as well as in the preprints, an up-dated review of the recent advances in the field, to be prepared by the Chairman, will also be published for each section.

Excursion guide-book will be received by those participating in field-trips.

#### EXCURSIONS:

A. In conjunction with the Conference the following field-trips will be arranged:

Field-trip No. 1. July 1st to 7th (Coach and Plane). Northwest Spain

Visits to deposits of kaolins of several genesis, talc, asbestos and refractory clays; kaolin washeries and brickwork factories. Tourist stops in: Valladolid, León, Santiago de Compsotela and Rias Bajas of Galicia.

Field-trip No. 2. July 1st to 5th (Coach). Eastern Spain

Visits to deposits of sedimentary kaolins, brick clays and sepiolite; kaolin washeries and ceramic factories. Tourist stops in: Valencia, Ciudad Encantada and Cuenca.

Field-trip No. 3. July 1st to 6th (Coach and Plane). Eastern Andalucia

Visits to deposits of sepiolite, serpentines, pyrophyllites, sericites, kaolinites and bentonites; various types of soils and ceramic and brickwork factories. Tourist stops in: Aranjuez, Granada, Sierra Nevada and Almeria.

Field-trip No. 4. July 1st to 7th (Coach and Plane). Western Andalucia

Visits to deposits of serpentines, vermiculites, talc and asbestos; "Rio Tinto" mines (pyrite and chalcopyrite); various types of soils and brickwork and ceramic factories. Tourist stops in: Córdoba, Sevilla, Huelva, Jerez and Málaga.

These four trips have been planned on a circuit basis, all of them starting and ending in Madrid.

B. In addition to the four field-trips, two optional one-day excursions will take place on the 29th of June:

Excursion No. 5. Toledo - Aranjuez.

Excursion No. 6. Segovia-La Granja.
