NEW BOOK

L'Atomistique Moderne et la Chimie. (Chemistry in the Light of Modern Atomic Theory.) By M. Haïssinsky. French Edition, revised, and enlarged by the Author. Preface by P. Langevin. G. Doin et Cie, Éditeurs, 8, Place de l'Odéon, Paris 6, France, 1932. vi + 386 pp. 47 figs. 14 × 21.5 cm. Price, 110 fr.

The Italian edition of this book has already been reviewed; there is little to be added to the statement of the former reviewer, and the reader may well be referred to the earlier review for more detail. The book is designed primarily for students who have little or no previous knowledge of modern atomic theory, and it covers a wide field in a brief and elementary but on the whole clear and satisfactory way. There is only one chapter on wave mechanics, the older quantum mechanics being used practically throughout; however, the modifications introduced by the newer theories are not disregarded. In one or two instances the method and order of presentation of certain topics may possibly leave a wrong impression with the beginner; thus it seems to the reviewer that too much emphasis has been placed on Kossel's electrostatic theory of valence in its original form, and the necessary modifications are discussed in various later places in the book. The reviewer cannot help remarking on the relatively large amount of space devoted to the radiation theory of gaseous reactions, which (as Haïssinsky, indeed, points out) is no longer believed by chemists to be of value. On the whole, however, the reviewer believes that the book may well be recommended to students desiring an elementary introduction to the particular field which it covers.
