

Largest and Best Meeting Ever, Predicted for New York Record

HISTORY will be made at the 22nd annual fall meeting of the American Oil Chemists' Society at the Hotel Pennsylvania, New York City, on November 15-17, 1948 with an anticipated banner attendance of 800 members and guests, an unprecedented total of 60 technical papers, and four half-day simultaneous sessions. Another innovation will be an alternate for the chairman at each technical session, according to Foster D. Snell, general chairman, and H. W. Vahlteich, program chairman.

Wednesday morning, industrial—C. M. Gooding or W. H. Goss; Wednesday morning, antioxidants—R. W. Riemenschneider or Mr. Gooding; Wednesday afternoon, research—A. E. Bailey or Mr. Riemenschneider.

Speakers at the banquet will be Col. Marston T. Bogert and Dr. Wallace P. Cohoe.

Fees are as follows: \$3 for members; \$5 for non-members; banquet, \$7.50. Headquarters for the ladies will be Room 7 on the Mezzanine, Monday, and Room 3 on Tuesday and Wednesday. Committees which will meet include Refining, Glycerine, Fats and Oils, Vitamin, Oil Color, Drying Oil, and Advertising in addition to the Governing Board.
