

Announce Outline for Short Course at the U. of I., Urbana

ATENTATIVE outline for lectures and field trips to be offered in the first short course sponsored by the American Oil Chemists' Society in Urbana, Ill., on August 16-21, 1948, in cooperation with the University of Illinois, is announced by the Special Education committee. Under the title of "Vegetable Oils, Their Production, Processing, and Uses," the subjects will include the following:

August 16:

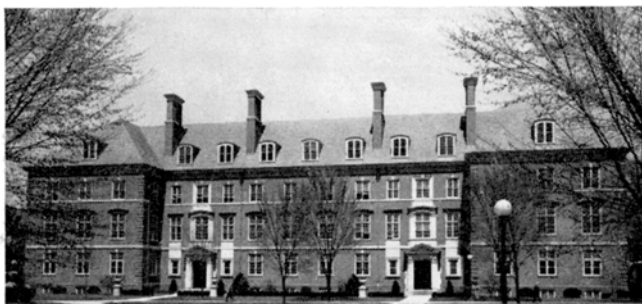
Raw materials: economics, culture, marketing, composition, and chemistry.

Field trip: University South Farms, 2 to 5 p.m.

August 17:

Production of Oil and Meal: history, hydraulic and expeller, theory of solvent extraction, practice of solvent extraction.

Field trip: Allerton Estate and picnic, 2 to 10 p.m.



Morning lectures from 8 to 12 o'clock will all be held in air-conditioned Gregory hall at the University of Illinois during the short course sponsored by the American Oil Chemists' Society and the university August 16-21, 1948, at Urbana.

August 18:

Processing of Oils: alkali refining and decolorizing, solvent refining and fractionation, hydrogenation, and deodorization.

Field trip: soybean mill, 2 to 5 p.m.

August 19:

Processing of Oils (cont.): plasticizing and packaging, utilization of foats, lecithin and sterols, and industrial utilization of fats.

Dinner: Urbana-Lincoln, 6:30 p.m.

August 20:

Utilization of Oils and Meals: culinary uses, animal feeds, human food, industrial uses of meal.

Field trip: university engineering campus, 2 to 5 p.m.

August 21:

Field trip: Soya bean processing and refining plants, Decatur, Ill., 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

All lectures will be held in air-conditioned Gregory hall on the university campus between 8 and 12 a.m.

A faculty of 20 experts in the technology of edible vegetable oils will serve the short course as lecturers, and among the early acceptances are those from A. E. Bailey, Girdler Corporation, Louisville, Ky., and W. H. Goss, Pillsbury Mills, Minneapolis, Minn.

Members of the Education Committee are A. R. Baldwin, R. R. King, H. R. Kraybill, and J. P. Harris, chairman, with President R. T. Milner serving ex-officio. University associates of the committee are R. B. Browne, dean of extension service and dean of the summer session; Robert K. Newton, extension specialist; and T. S. Hamilton, professor of animal nutrition.
