J. C. Konen

Konen Is Vice President at ADM

The election of James C. Konen as a vice president and Earl E. Branson, Ralph Bruce, and Frank J. Seidl Jr. as assistant vice presidents has been announced by Archer-Daniels-Midland-Company, Minneapolis, Minn. Burton W. Where standard methods are not available, the method to be used will be specified. Charges will be nominal, just sufficient to cover the charge of packaging and mailing.
