Wins First A.O.C.S.—Wiley Award

LOYD C. MITCHELL, research chemist of the Food and Drug Administration, has been selected to receive the annual Harvey W. Wiley Award of the Association of Official Agricultural Chemists. He is the first winner of the award, which was established last year to honor the father of the original Pure Food and Drug Law. The award consists of \$500 in cash and is presented for an outstanding contribution to the development of methods for the analysis of foods, drugs, cosmetics, feeds, fertilizers, pesticides, and oils, or for use in general analytical chemistry.

A food chemist since 1909, the recipient has developed many methods of analysis for spices, cereals, dairy products, and eggs. More recently he has contributed toward the development of the techniques of paper chromatography.
