## Annual Awards Established

The Protective Coatings Division of the Chemical Institute of Canada, Ottawa, Ontario, has announced the establishment of two annual awards, \$100 first prize and \$25 second prize, for technical papers submitted by members of the Institute and by undergraduate and graduate students of Canadian universities. The papers, which must be concise, informative discussions of approximately 3,000 to 6,000 words and containing 200- to 300-word abstracts, will be rated on the following points: originality, scientific importance, practical value to the paint, varnish, or lacquer industries, completeness of discussion, significance of deductions, and quality of composition. #### President Reviews Year

Addressing the 37th Congress of the International Association of Seed Crushers at Cannes, France, on June 2, 1959, the president, Guy Chipperfield, commented that the year since Brussels had been a difficult one. Apart from low-priced whale and palm oil, butter, and lard, the combination of the drought in the Philippines and the unrest in Indonesia affected both the stability of prices and the relative consumption of the various vegetable oils.

Mr. Chipperfield mentioned the problem of U. S. surpluses and subsidies and recommended the desirability of exploring outlets in so-called "backward" countries rather than embarrass markets accustomed to normal quantities. He also discussed efforts to improve the quality of copra, the need for a universal metric system, and adjustments to the European Economic Community.
