Adds Three Papers to Program

I N ADDITION to the "complete" program of 55 technical papers announced in the September issue of the Journal of the American Oil Chemists' Society, there will actually be three more according to the chairman, W. C. Ault, who is with the Eastern Regional Research Laboratory in Philadelphia. Titles for these are:

- Polymerizable Derivatives of Long-Chain Fatty Alcohols. III. Copolymers of Some Alkyl Acrylates and Acrylonitrile, by E. F. Jordan Jr., W. E. Palm, and W. S. Port, Eastern Regional Research Laboratory, Philadelphia, Pa.
- The Acetolysis of Glycerides. 1 and II, by Edwin M. Meade, Meade Laboratory and Process Company, Unionville, Ont., Canada, and Dilys Walder Manion, Canada Packers Ltd., Toronto, Ont., Canada

In general, the papers to be presented at the 34th fall meeting of the Society at the Hotel New Yorker, on October 17-19, 1960, will range from applications of newer methodology to problems in fat research, detergents, chemical derivatives of fats, fat processing, special edible fats, and biochemistry of fats, including nutritional aspects, to industrial markets for fat and oil derivatives. Essentially all of the papers will describe original research.

Exhibit space is in charge of Henry G. Salomon of L. A. Salomon and Bro., New York. Hotel chairman F. B. White of the Foster Wheeler Corporation, assisted by J. J. Geminder of Chas. Pfizer and Company, urges immediate reservations direct with the New Yorker.

General entertainment will include the Sunday mixer, a cocktail party Monday given by Distillation Products Industries, and the dinner dance Tuesday. The ladies, with Mrs. E. A.
