

This new manner of handling annual distribution of Revisions operates as an indefinite subscription.

Over the past few months, all those who maintain currently revised sets of AOCS Methods have been offered an opportunity to enter a standing order. With such orders in hand, the AOCS Headquarters can prepare permanent addressing facilities for the recipients. Just as soon as a new set of Additions and Revisions is ready, it is automatically mailed to all those on the standing order list. Billing follows, at the standard rate. Early delivery, dependability, and lack of annual correspondence are a few of the advantages of this system. The standing order list already contains over 600 names.

A standard price of \$3.00 has been placed upon Annual Additions and Revisions. This price will be maintained just as long as costs permit, which should be a substantial length of time.

Individual orders may now be placed for the 1962 Additions and Revisions. The price is \$3.00. Orders originating in Illinois, add 4% State Tax. Remittance should be sent with orders. If standing order is desired, payment need not accompany order. 1962 Additions and Revisions will be sent on all standing orders.
