Norris Embree Appointed to National Research Council

N. D. Embree (1940), vice-president in charge of technical operations, Distillation Products Industries Division of Eastman Kodak Company, has been appointed a member of the National Research Council in the Division of Chemistry and Chemical Technology. His term will be for a period of three years, through June, 1968.

He is serving the NRC as chairman of the division's Committee on Fats and Oils, and as a member of the Advisory Panel on Food Chemicals Codex and of the Industrial Liaison Panel of Food Protection Committee.

The Council has wide-ranging functions that include looking into the broad possibilities of science, stimulating research in general, promoting cooperation in research at home and abroad, and directing the attention of scientific and technical investigators to the importance of military and industrial problems in connection with national defense.

Dr. Embree began his association with Eastman Kodak in 1934. He was a member of the research and development group that became Distillation Products Industries in 1939. He has been concerned with the production of vitamins, fats, and oils and has directed research leading to many new methods and processes for highvacuum distillation and for vitamin products.

Among numerous professional affiliations, he has served as president of the American Oil Chemists' Society, chairman of the Rochester Section of the American Chemical Society, and is currently a member of the advisory committee of the National Vitamin Foundation, of the research committee of the Pharmaceutical Manufacturers Association, of the advisory board of Gordon Research Conferences, and of the International Union of Pure and Applied Chemistry.



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
