Conneran of IBM to Speak on Computer Control

Returning to its regular meeting place, Whytes Restaurant, Fulton Street, New York, the December 7th meeting of the Northeast Section will feature a speech by James Conneran on the subject "Computer Control in the Chemical Industry." Mr. Conneran is extremely well qualified in his subject as he is presently industry representative to the petroleum and chemical industry, control systems marketing, of International Business Machines Corporation. After graduating from Rutgers University in 1944 with a degree in Chemical Engineering, he worked on instrumentation and control systems for American Cyanamid and Du Pont.

Speaker for the meeting will be W. L. Stanley, Chief of Fruit Research, Western Regional Research Laboratory, Albany, California. His topic will be "Chemical Aspects of Flavor."

Dr. Stanley was educated in the North China American School near Peking and received his A.B. degree from Marietta College, Marietta, Ohio, in 1939. He worked in the process control laboratories of Union Carbide Company in South Charleston, West Virginia until 1945 when he entered the University of California, Berkeley, for graduate study in organic chemistry with James Cason. He obtained his Ph.D. degree in 1948 and joined the staff of the Western Regional Research Laboratory in Albany, California, where he was engaged in studies on the composition of vegetable flavors until 1951. After a three-year hiatus in petrochemicals research at the Union Oil Company Research Center in Brea, California, he returned to the Western Regional Research Laboratory field station (Fruit and Vegetable Chemistry Laboratory) in Pasadena, California, where, from 1954 to 1960, he studied the composition of the citrus essential oils. In 1960 he returned to the Western Regional Research Laboratory in Albany, California, and currently is Chief of Fruit Research.
