### Hilditch Response Received

The Section was sorry to hear that Professor Hilditch had a sudden heart attack about the time of the Bailey Award Dinner Meeting. From his very gracious letter acknowledging receipt of the award, we are very glad to learn that he is recovering satisfactorily and that he took such great pleasure in receiving the Alton E. Bailey Medal. The text of the letter follows:

"I have heard from Dr. Gunstone of the success of the A. E. Bailey Award Meeting at the beginning of May, when he received on my behalf from the North Central Section of the American Oil Chemists' Society the A. E. Bailey Award for 1965.

"Dr. Gunstone brought back with him the award plaque and also an outline of the award meeting on May 5th. The plaque is a very handsome permanent record of this award and will be preserved in my family, I hope, as a permanent record of your kindness.

"I wished to write this formal acknowledgment of my indebtedness to the Section, but by the time the date of your meeting approached I myself was in hospital after a sudden attack of some kind of heart trouble, which appears to be clearing up to the satisfaction of my medical advisers. This led to some confusion in my postal arrangements here, and I am sorry that this letter has been left for so long.

"I would repeat once more how very much I value being associated with the late Alton E. Bailey in this way. You originally referred to the inclusion of a modest honorarium with the award of the Medal. I now find, of course, that the Section's idea of a "modest" honorarium is in the region of one hundred pounds sterling. I can only thank you again for this further sign of your esteem and kindness towards me, and for the cheque for £100 sterling which was enclosed with the award.

"I shall look forward in due course to reading in the Journal the official account of the award proceedings, and in the meantime I shall be grateful if you will let members of your Section know what pleasure their action in adding me to the list of A. E. Bailey medallists has given me.'

## Names in the News

One of the USDA employees to be honored in recent award ceremonies at Washington was R. W. Riemenschneider (1942), a Philadelphia area chemist who supervised the perfection of elegant techniques now being used by re-
