## Lipid Progress Award Presented to Retired USDA Chemist

R. W. Riemenschneider (1942) of Glenside, Pa., a US Department of Agriculture chemist for 34 years until his retirement last December, received the Progress of Lipid Research Award of the Northeast Section, American Oil Chemists' Society, at a dinner meeting in New York City June 7.

Mr. Riemenschneider, who worked at the Eastern utilization research laboratory of USDA's Agricultural Research Service in Wyndmoor, Pa. (near Philadelphia), has an international reputation for his basic research on the structure and composition of animal and vegetable fats and for the elegant techniques he perfected for their analysis. These techniques, which permit complete characterization of the fats on the basis of samples weighing only a few milligrams, are now being widely used by researchers in medicine, nutrition, industry and agriculture. In his last year of Government service, Mr. Riemenschneider received the Superior Service Award of the USDA for his work.

The Progress of Lipid Research Award plaque was presented to Mr. Riemenschneider by S. S. Chang, President of the Northeast Section, American Oil Chemists' Society.

A native of Kampsville, Ill., Mr. Riemenschneider is a graduate of the University of Illinois and holds a master's degree from the University of Maryland.
