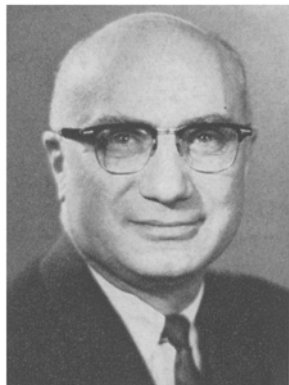


# Reiser Becomes AOCS Presidential Candidate

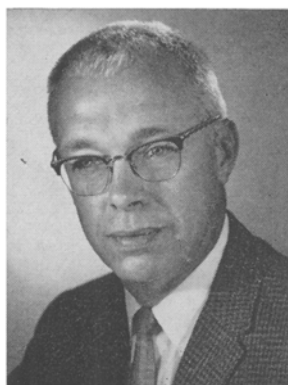
