## PREPARES WELCOME FOR 60th MEETING



Members of the Northern California Section of the American Oil Chemists' Society and San Francisco, the city by the Golden Gate, look forward to the role as host to our Society's 60th Annual Meeting, April 20-24, 1969.

Nineteen years have passed since San Francisco had the opportunity of hosting our Society. The 24th AOCs Fall Meeting was held in San Francisco September 26-29, 1950. At that time the president of the Society was J. R. Mays, Jr.—now retired from his position as President of the Barrow-Agee Labs, Inc., Memphis, Tenn., and presently Emeritus Member of the Society—the Vice-President was A. E. Bailey, Secretary H. L. Roschen, and Treasurer J. J. Vollertsen.

Forty-six papers were presented at the 24th Meeting, in five sessions:

Processing Techniques—Detergents—Miscellaneous, 12 papers; Safflower Seed Oil—Drying Oils, 9; Biochemistry—Nutrition, 8; Stability—Antioxidants—Analysis, 8; Chemical Modification—Synthesis—Miscellaneous, 9.

Over the years elapsed since then, the Society's Scientific Meetings have grown considerably in size and scope. A preview of sessions to be held at the 60th Meeting already has 17 sessions programmed, in which approximately 150 papers are expected to be presented.

The inclusion of exhibitors is still under consideration. If an Exposition is scheduled, nearly 50 technical exhibit booths will be presented, as opposed to the 16 which accompanied the last Meeting in San Francisco.

Aside from a technical program of outstanding professional significance for the Society's members and guests, the location chosen for the 60th Meeting also deserves mention.

One of the most scenic drives in America is the "Thirty-Mile" Drive of San Francisco. Through the Civic Center to Mission Dolores—Twin Peaks for a magnificent view of the city, bay and ocean—the Japanese Tea Garden in Golden Gate Park and then the world-renowned Cliff House, overlooking Seal Rocks and the blue Pacific. The return takes you past the approach of the Golden Gate Bridge, the Presidio, Marina and Yacht Harbor, and Fisherman's Wharf.

San Francisco is a "jewel of many facets" and even the most seasoned globe trotter will find much that will interest and intrigue.

Plan now to join your colleagues at the 60th Annual Meeting in San Francisco!
