AOCS HONORED STUDENT PROGRAM CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

R. T. Holman, Chairman of the AOCS Honored Student Award Program, has issued a call for nomination of outstanding graduate students in the

field of Fats, Oils and Lipids.

The Honored Student Program was established in 1963 under the direction of the AOCS Education Committee. The Program awards to selected students an all-expense paid trip to attend AOCS National Meetings.

Several awards will be conferred in 1970 and all will be made for attendance at the ISF-AOCS World Congress which will be held in Chicago, September 27-October 1, 1970. Foreign students will be nominated by their respective national organizations

and need not apply directly.

International Conference on the Biochemistry of Lipids to be Held in Sweden

The Fourteenth International Conference on the Biochemistry of Lipids will be held in Lund, Sweden on June 9-12, 1970. The main theme of the Conference will be Sterol Metabolism. On the last day of the Conference, a symposium on Lipolytic Enzymes will be organized.

Plenary lectures will be delivered by invited speakers. Papers for short communications on the subjects of the Conference and the Symposium are invited. An abstract of not more than 200 words and preferably in English should be submitted before April 1, 1970.

Those who have sent their preliminary registration forms before February 1st will receive a final registration form shortly thereafter with a preliminary program and additional information. The final registration form must be received before April 1st in order to allow enough time for the distribution of the final program and of the abstracts by May 15th. Because of local arrangements, the number of participants will be limited to 150 and will be selected in order of registration.

Society of Cosmetic Chemists Announces Scholarship Grants

The Board of Directors of the Society of Cosmetic Chemists has announced an initial disbursement of \$4500 in scholarship grants to further education in cosmetic science. On the recommendation of the Society's Education Committee Chairman Dr. Winthrop E. Lange (of Purdue Frederick & Associates, Yonkers, N.Y.), six colleges and Universities will share these founds. Recipients are: Columbia University College of Pharmaceutical Sciences, N.Y., N.Y.; Massachusetts College of Pharmacy, Boston, Mass.; Roosevelt University, Chicago, Ill.; St. John's University College of Pharmacy, Jamaica, N.Y.; St. Louis College of Pharmacy, St. Louis, Mo.; and West Virginia University School of Pharmacy,

Morgantown, W. Va.

Each of these schools presently offers at least one course on some facet of cosmetic science. The funds are to be expended at the discretion of the supervising faculty

member indicated.
