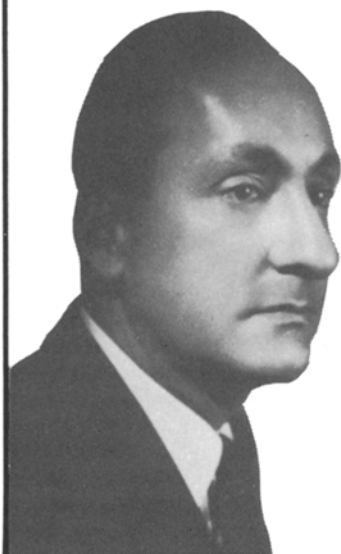


Emile Harp
