#### Day of Study Held by French Association

Madame Juillet, secretary general of the French Association for the Study of Fatty Matter, reported that J. Baltes, president, Deutsche Gesellschaft fur Fettwissenschaft, and M. Toy-Riont, president, Chambre Syndicale de la Margarinerie, received Chevreul Medals in December. On that occasion, the French Association for the Study of Fatty Matter had organized a Day of Study.

The theme of the program was "Physicochemistry in Margarines." Baltes spoke to the group on hydrogenation, F. Mordret discussed obtaining and interpretation of aromagrams, and M. Naudet spoke on the study of crystallization of margarine by RMN.

After these speeches, the ceremony to present the Chevreul Medals was held.

Following the presentation, Toy-Riont gave an introductory speech. The technology of spreadable margarines was the topic of disucssion by C. Bouffard. J.P. Steiner discussed the spectrum of habitation of a margarine in a continuous drum installation, and J.W.E. Coenen spoke on the chemical and physical modification of fatty matter. The Syndicat de la Margarinerie closed the Day of Study with a discussion of economic data.


# Teipel promoted to senior scientist
