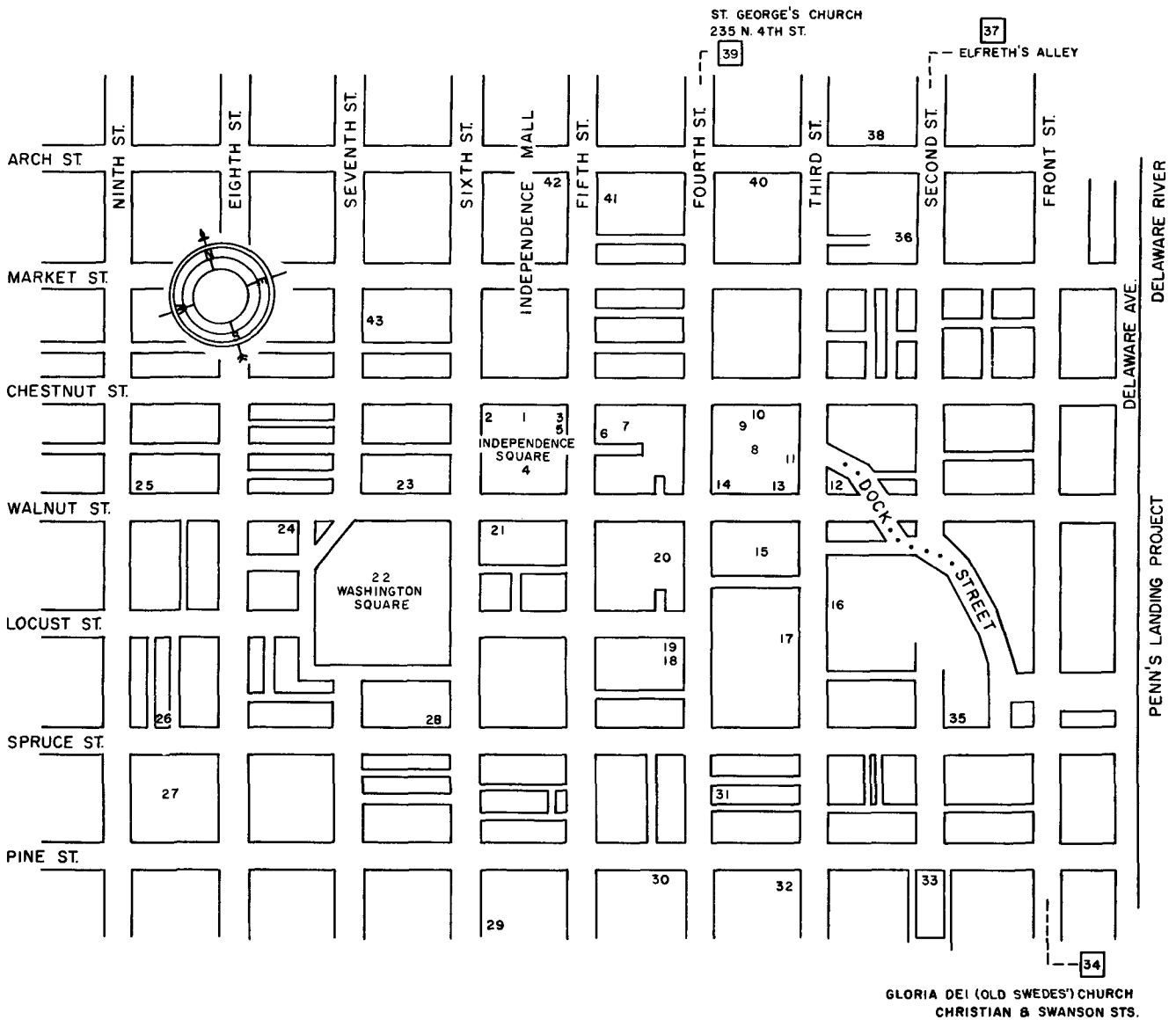


Historic Philadelphia—a sightseer's paradise
