

Headquarters for the ladies' program will be the Sheraton's Café Careme, where a coffee will be held on Sunday afternoon. Continental breakfast will be served there Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday mornings.

Monday's program will feature a morning tour to the Bryn Athyn Cathedral, one of suburban Philadelphia's outstanding examples of Gothic architecture. After lunch at a country inn, there will be a brief stop at the Beth Shalom Synagogue, which was designed by Frank Lloyd Wright.

On Tuesday, the ladies will visit Winterthur, 60 acre gardens developed by Henry Francis duPont.
