R. T. Holman named *Lipids* editor

Ralph T. Holman, professor of biochemistry, University of Minnesota Hormel Institute, and newly installed president of AOCS, has been named editor of *Lipids*.

He replaces Walter O. Lundberg, who recently announced his retirement. Lundberg had been editor of *Lipids* since 1966.

Holman, who has been an associate editor of *Lipids* since 1966, has served as board-member-at-large, secretary, and vice-president of AOCS. He has been active in several AOCS Committees, including Nomenclature, Biochemistry and Nutrition, *Journal*, and Honored Student Award. In addition, he has served as chairman of several symposia at AOCS annual meetings.

He was presented the Bailey Award by the AOCS North Central Section in 1972 and was the recipient of the Borden Award, presented by the American Institute of Nutrition.

Holman is a member of the American Society of Biological Chemists, American Chemical Society, American Institute of Nutrition, and Society for Experimental Biology and Medicine.

Since 1952, he has been editor of "Progress in the Chemistry of Fats and Other Lipids." He was on the Committee on Fats, Food and Nutrition Board, NRC-NAC from 1960-66 and served on the editorial boards of *Journal of Lipid Research* and *Journal of Nutrition*.

Holman was a National Research Council Fellow at Medical Nobel Institute, Stockholm, in 1946-47 and was an American Scandinavian Foundation Fellow, University of Uppsala 1947-48. Prior to his association with the University of Minnesota, he was an associate professor of biochemistry and nutrition, Texas A&M University.

He received his B.S. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Minnesota and his Masters degree from Rutgers University. ■

Wells, Aftergood, Alfin-Slater share Bond Award Medal

The AOCS Bond Award Committee has announced that Penelope Wells, presenting author, and Lila Aftergood and Roslyn B. Alfin-Slater, coauthors, have won the Bond Award Gold Medal for their paper, "The Effect of Sterculic Acid on Aflatoxicosis in Rats Fed Diets Containing Saturated and Unsaturated Fat."

The authors are associated with the School of Public Health, University of California, Los Angeles, Calif.

W.G. Doeden, Research and Development Center, Swift & Co., Oak Brook, Ill., received second place, honorable mention, for his paper, "Evaluation of the Mettler Automatic Dropping Point Apparatus and Statistical Comparison with the Wiley Melting Point Method."

Michael M. Blumenthal, presenting author, and Stephen S. Chang, coauthor, both of the Department of Food Science, Rutgers State University, New Brunswick, N.J., received third place, honorable mention, for their paper, "Effect of Different Fats and Oils on the Flavor of Deep Fat Fried Foods."
