


Brunthaver to discuss current fats and oils situation



Carroll G. Brunthaver, formerly an assistant secretary of agriculture, will be keynote speaker at the American Oil Chemists' Society's 66th Annual Spring Meeting to be held in Dallas, Texas, April 27-May 1, 1975. His topic will be "Current Fats and Oils Situation—Domestic Supply versus World Demand."

Brunthaver, who served as assistant secretary of agriculture for International Affairs and Commodity Programs from 1972-74, currently is vice president of Cook Industries, Inc., Memphis, Tenn. He is in charge of administration of the Agriproducts Group, which includes the Grain Division, the Cotton Division, and the Processing and Refining Division.

A native of Fremont, Ohio, he received his bachelor's, master's, and PhD degrees in agricultural economics from Ohio State University.

In the early part of his career, he served as an assistant county extension agent, and he also held positions on the agricultural economics faculties at Ohio State and Michigan State Universities.

From 1961-1966, he was director of research for the Grain and Feed Dealers' National Association. Then, from 1966-1969, he was associate director of research for Comco, the agricultural economic research department of Cook Industries, Inc.

As a senior fellow at The Brookings Institute, Washington, D.C., Brunthaver did research on national and international food reserve policies.
