Under the direction of the Smalley Check Sample Committee, AOCS again presented Certificates of Proficiency to a number of chemists at the Society's 66th Annual Spring Meeting.

The Cup, presented annually by the Smalley Check Sample Committee, is given to the chemist with the highest proficiency in the Combined Determination of Moisture, Oil, and Nitrogen in the Oilseed Meal Series.

The Smalley Check Sample Program, sponsored by AOCS for ca. 60 years, is a competitive Program designed to measure the proficiency of individual laboratory efforts, calibration of equipment, etc. The basic purpose of the Program is to provide a means by which an individual chemist can check his own work, equipment, and reagents against the performance of his peers throughout the world. Participants in the program can select from 16 different sample series, including such commodities as cottonseed, soybean, peanuts, tallow and grease, copra, and others. Ca. 500 chemists participate in the Smalley Program annually.


