### Analytical Methods for Mycotoxins Available

There has been a worldwide concern over the last decade about the possible harmful effects of residues of toxigenic molds (mycotoxins) in food or feed. The ensuing toxicological studies, surveys, or regulatory efforts have been made possible by the development and rapid dissemination of validated, simple analytical methods, first for aflatoxins, and more recently for ochratoxins, patulin, and sterigmatocystin. The work of Associate Referees for citrinin, penicillic acid, trichothecenes, and zeralenone bears promise of more mycotoxin methods to come. To facilitate the dissemination and use of the many methods now available, and to create the possibility of a practical system for providing more frequently updated compilations, Chapter 26 (Natural Poisons, Mycotoxins) of the AOAC Book of Official Methods is being offered as a separate paperback. This first offering contains four new methods adopted in October, 1974, which were too late for inclusion in the 12th edition of the book. Dr. Ruth R. Benerito has been named Honorary Member of Iota Sigma Pi, national honor society for women in chemistry. She is a member of AOCS. A Research Leader at the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Southern Regional Research Center in New Orleans, Dr. Benerito joins the ranks of other world known women chemists, including Nobel laureates Drs. Marie Curie, Gerti Cori, and Dorothy Crowfoot Hodgkin. The honor was awarded at a banquet June 19, 1975, in Houston, Texas. ■
